## Greening Historic Buildings

The number of traditional buildings (pre 1919) makes up more than 20% of the nations building stock. It is vital that methods of improving energy efficiency in this sector are sought whilst safeguarding the special character of our historic built environment.

The conference will explore the way in which the carbon footprint of traditional buildings can be reduced by increased energy efficiency, thereby making a positive contribution to the challenge of global warming.

The day will focus on a review of the technical as well as statutory considerations of improving the thermal efficiency of traditional buildings, as well as reviewing the range of renewable technologies and their appropriateness in the context of the historic built environment. The conference will also consider the financial considerations of these technologies and sources of grant aid. The afternoon will focus on a series of case studies of the adaptation and “retrofitting” of traditional buildings by building professionals.
